Make the following assessments of the first ten pages according to the DARTS checklist (DARTS is an acronym of the words Date, Author, References, Type and Sponsor): 1. Date: Is the information up-to-date?		
2. Author: Who is the author of the toyt? Is he or she a qualified expert in his or her field?		
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3. References: Does the site tell you what its information is based on? Can the references be traced easily?		
4. Type: What is the purpose of the text? Is it an advertisement, an opinion piece, or does it seek to provide objective information?		
5. Sponsor: Who finances the page? A sponsor might have an effect on the point of view of the site.

Which of the websites you found are reliable?
